The Stanford and Judith C. Lipsey Veterinary Clinic (**Lipsey Clinic**) is a response to the generosity of a philanthropic family in partnership with a historic animal welfare organization who determined the need for such a program and facility through years of research and providing services in this community. **The SPCA Serving Erie County** in Buffalo, New York, a non-profit organization, has been in business for 153 years, 2nd only to the ASPCA in North America.

Pet wellness and pet retention are important efforts in animal welfare and far too many pets in Western New York are either surrendered to crowded shelters for cost reasons or living in homes without proper wellness, preventative, or other needed care provided by their owners. In its first years of operations, nearly 75% of surveyed pet owners using the Lipsey Clinic shared that they did not use a veterinarian, but now will, thanks to the services provided at an affordable cost.

The Lipsey Clinic, opened in 2017 has the size (6,500 square feet), the design, the equipment, as well as the trained personnel to provide a wide variety of services to pet owners. Most services fall into three categories: wellness, medical, or surgical, and are currently available five days per week.

**POSITION SUMMARY AND MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:** The Lipsey Clinic Veterinarian will perform surgical spays, neuters and other soft tissue and/or orthopedic surgeries in addition to providing medical care to animals in our low cost public clinic aimed at pet retention and pet wellness. The ideal candidate will be adaptable and thrive in a fast-paced environment. A strong work ethic and a commitment are required to our mission to reduce the unwanted pet overpopulation and promote animal health.

The Veterinarian will assist in training Veterinary Students, staff and volunteers. A Veterinary License in NY State is required. DEA license is preferred.

One year of experience in a veterinary practice with emphasis on spay/neuter skills is preferred. Must be able to evaluate health status in an objective manner and determine most appropriate treatment for an animal within the means of the pet owner.
